Dear Maxwell Hardwood Flooring Customer:

On April 26, 2008, the California Air Resource Board (CARB) approved the world's most sweeping restrictions on emissions of formaldehyde, a cancer-causing chemical. The restrictions cut, by nearly 60%, the allowable formaldehyde emissions that seep into the air from the resin or glue most commonly used to bond plywood, particleboard and medium density fiberboard. These same standards set by California are expected to take effect nationwide soon.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that Maxwell Hardwood products which include any plywood products used in the manufacturing process of our Townsend Additions Unfinished Engineered Flooring are subjected to scientific testing relative to compliance with CARB 2 regulations and emissions of HCOH (Formaldehyde), and that the results of that testing reveal that Maxwell Hardwood products are BLQ (Below Limit of Quantification).

As always, our company is committed to manufacturing products that are environmentally friendly as well as safe for the consumer. All Maxwell Hardwood Flooring products are made in the USA.
